Subject: Conflict-Free Supply Chain Due Diligence

To whom it may concern,

Several metals commonly used in the electronics industry, including gold (Au), tantalum (Ta), tungsten (W), and tin (Sn) have a variety of sources, some of which have been termed "Covered Countries". The following statements describe our policy on procurement of these minerals from Covered Countries for Micro-Measurements.

Vishay Measurements Group will continue to exercise due diligence within its supply chain to assure no raw minerals are procured from a Covered Country, defined as the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) and its nine bordering countries.

Vishay Measurements Group is committed to sourcing responsibly and considers any mining activities that support conflict as unacceptable. To further this commitment, Vishay Measurements Group is actively engaged in assessing its current supply chain to further communications with customers and address its sourcing requirements. Upon the availability of information meeting your request, Vishay Measurements Group will immediately forward a response.

Vishay Measurements Group's efforts related to conflict minerals are aligned with those of the Electronic Industry Citizenship Coalition® EICC® and the Global e-Sustainability Initiative (GESI). The EICC's and GESI's work includes the Conflict-Free Smelter Program and the Conflict Minerals Reporting Template.
